Most Significant Career Research Contributions

Since 1975, Joan Martinez-Alier has held the position of Professor in the Department of Economics and Economic History in the Universitat Autònoma de Barcelona in Spain. Over the past 20 years he has gained recognition as Europe's foremost scholar of and spokesperson for the new field of "ecological economics." In 1987 he joined together with international colleagues from around the world as a founding member of the International Society for Ecological Economics.

Martinez-Alier has extensive international experience in a wide variety of educational institutions around the world. He was a Research Fellow at St. Antony's College, Oxford University from 1966 to 1973 and again a visiting scholar there in 1984-85. He has held visiting appointments at the Free University of Berlin (1980-81), Stanford University, the University of California, Davis (1988-89) and FLACSO-Ecuador in Quito (1994-95). In 1999-2000, Martinez-Alier was a Fellow in the Program in Agrarian Studies at Yale University in New Haven. Since 1990 Professor Martinez-Alier has served as the Editor of the journal *Ecologia Politica* (Barcelona).

Martinez-Alier's research and professional focus has been in the fields of agrarian studies, ecological economics and political ecology. In Europe he was involved in a two-year international collaborative study of environmental standards known as the Environmental Valuation in Europe (EVE) project,

funded by the European Commission. In addition to his professional research in European and industrialized areas, Martinez-Alier has been concerned with exploring the implications of ecological economics for developing countries. He has directed the European project CEECEC, Civil Society Engagement with Ecological Economics, www.ceecec.net, which resulted in the production of a Handbook ("Ecological Economics from the Ground Up"), likely to be published in 2011 by Earthscan, London.

From 1991 to 1996 he contributed to the design and production of a series of four videos dealing with the theory and practical application of the concepts of ecological economics in development strategies. These videos form a series presented by Griesinger Films and they include: An Introduction to Ecological Economics, Investing In Natural Capital, Conversation for a Sustainable Society and Costa Rica Counts the Future. He is a former president of the International Society for Ecological Economics.

His current research focuses on ecological economics and languages of valuation, political ecology, environmental history, environmental justice and the environmentalism of the poor. He has directed the doctoral programme in the Environmental Sciences at the UAB, and he is a senior member in the Ecological Economics group at ICTA UAb (www.eco2bcn.es).
